Behind the Bullet explores a side of gun violence that's rarely talked about- the impact a shooting has on the shooter. The film takes an intimate, non-polarizing look at how taking a life forever changed four people emotionally, psychologically and spiritually, offering a powerful new perspective on gun violence in the United States.

Long Synopsis

Every year, almost 40,000 people are shot and killed in America. Each shooting devastates the victim's family and friends. Behind the Bullet explores a side of gun violence that's rarely talked about - the impact a shooting has on the shooter. Four individuals share how pulling the trigger changed them emotionally, physically, psychologically, and spiritually. They describe the moral injury that comes after a self-defense, accidental, or unintentional shooting, offering a new and unbiased perspective on gun violence.



Director Heidi Yewman

Heidi's passion for gun violence prevention began in 1999 when her former basketball coach and teacher, Dave Sanders was killed in the Columbine High School massacre along with 12 students. Heidi is a graduate of Columbine.

In 2009 she wrote the book, Beyond the Bullet: Personal Stories of Gun Violence Aftermath, profiling 19 people forever altered by the impact of gun violence. She is a tireless advocate for gun safety, sitting on the boards of Brady United to Prevent Gun Violence,



Women Donors Network, Stop our Shootings, and Trauma Intervention Program of Portland, OR. Heidi's vast experience working with trauma victims, advocating for gun violence solutions, and community organizing has inspired her to find unique ways to look at gun violence which creates a more meaningful dialog.

Heidi has been published in USA Today, Ms. Magazine, The Seattle Times, The Oregonian and the Columbian. Heidi's four-part series, *My Month With a Gun* was published in The Denver Post, Ms. Magazine and The Daily Beast.

Heidi's first feature documentary, *Behind the Bullet*, is being released in 2019. The film provides an in-depth look at the lives of four individuals who've shot someone and the profound impact it's had on their lives.

Director's Statement

I made *Behind the Bullet* because I wanted to know what it feels like to be the "good guy with a gun."

I wanted to look at gun violence from a different angle. I wanted to get past the hyperbole and the entrenched arguments and instead explore a viewpoint nobody thinks about: what happens when you use a gun for the purpose that it's designed for to shoot someone.

The Columbine High School 1999 massacre is where it all began for me. I graduated from Columbine 13 years before the shooting and one of the victims was my former basketball coach Dave Sanders. As I sat at his memorial service watching my traumatized teachers weeping, one of the speakers said, "We can't control what happens. But we can control how we respond."

After that, I got active.

I wrote a book *Beyond the Bullet* about 19 people who were shot and how it affected them and their families. As I wrote the book I started to think about the people who pulled the triggers; the people who were behind those bullets.

That led me to write a four-piece series for Ms. Magazine, My Month With a Gun where I carried a 9mm Glock with me everywhere I went so I could experience the emotional and physical ramifications of always being prepared to defend myself and my family from a bad guy.

That experience evolved into *Behind the Bullet*. The four stories in my documentary focus on common gun violence situations - suicide, accidental child shootings, street crime, and the widespread fear of a home invasion.

Behind the Bullet provides a different perspective on gun violence. Some of the stories came from an NRA website, where they're heralded as success stories - people who'd heroically upheld the Second Amendment by defending themselves and their families. The PTSD and moral injury that ensues even when the shooting was justified or deemed unintentional under American law is surprising. As the interviews unfold it becomes apparent that the shooters suffer profound anguish, and the reality of being the "good guy with a gun" in America comes into focus.

The Characters



Kevin Leonard shot two intruders who were stealing items out of his home in rural Washington State. One of them died as he tried to run away. Kevin was traumatized by the experience. He has created an elaborate defense system around his home including trip wires, guns strategically placed around his home, and motion detectors while carrying a gun on him at all times.



Will Little grew up on the streets of Philadelphia where violence, drugs and death were a part of his everyday experience. After being shot at by a group of teens after exiting a roller rink, Will shot back, killing an 18 year old. He was charged with murder and served 10 years in prison where he reformed himself. He has dedicated the past 19 years to giving back to his community thru mentoring young boys, speaking at schools, half-way houses, prisons, and organizations dedicated to stopping the recurring violence. Much of his work focuses on stopping retaliative shootings.



Christen McGinnes bought a gun for self defense in case someone broke into her apartment. She did not know a few years later so many things in her life would fall apart and she would use that gun to try and kill herself. Three weeks after pulling the trigger, she woke up from a coma with half her face missing. She spent the next 5 years enduring 46 surgeries to reconstruct her face. In Florida, we see the 47th surgery while learning the toll it has taken on her.



Taylor Dwyer was 8-years-old when he found his mom's gun by her bedside table and accidentally shot and killed his 5-year-old brother. We pick up his story 10 years later at his home with his Dad in North Carolina where he talks about the guilt, sadness, and heaviness he lives with everyday. His family shares their heartache from losing their child while working to protect Taylor from the burden of killing his little brother.
